
# Scotland's Climate Change Plan update

## The Climate Change Plan update



- Commitment to update 2018 CCP to account for our latest emissions reduction targets (2019 Act), including 75% reduction by 2030 and net zero by 2045.
- Planned to be laid in Parliament in April but was postponed and will now be recast around a green recovery from COVID-19.
- The update is non-statutory, meaning it doesn't need to include much of the information specified in the 2019 Act.
- Emissions reduction across 7 sectors: transport, agriculture, waste, electricity, Industry, buildings, LULUCF.
- Informed by the public and experts, including the UK CCC, the Just Transition Commission and the public and stakeholders from across academia, industry, business, trade unions and environmental organisations.



### New context: a green recovery

- Unprecedented changes as a result of this pandemic
- While not to be celebrate, opportunity to ensure a green recovery
- Opportunity to build on positive behaviours
- Unfortunately also negative consequences







#### Green recovery announcements



- Programme for Government goes some way to demonstrating our commitment to our climate change targets and a green recovery.
  - Includes Nearly 1.6 billion low carbon funding to transform the heat and energy efficiency of our buildings over the next Parliament.
  - £500 million for infrastructure to support active travel over the next five years.
  - £100m to a new Green Jobs Fund over the next five years.
  - a £60m Youth Guarantee, providing increased opportunities for 'green' apprenticeships
  - £60 million to support the industrial manufacturing sector
  - Investing an additional £130m to expand Scotland's national forests
  - boosting our energy efficiency programme so by 2021 we will have allocated more than £1 billion towards making people's homes warmer and cheaper to heat.
